Purpose

We also provide opportunities for pupils to experience a sense of achievement through sport, the creative arts and the use of technology which is central to the school's successful philosophy of developing self-esteem.

Our curriculum will give children the opportunity to:

- Spiritual - Explore beliefs, experience and faiths, feelings and values; enjoy learning about oneself, others and the surrounding world; use imagination and creativity and reflect on experiences
- Moral - Recognise right and wrong and respect the law; understand consequences; investigate moral and ethical issues and offer reasoned views
- Social - Use a range of social skills to participate in the local community and beyond; appreciate diverse viewpoints; participate, volunteer and cooperate; resolve conflict
- Cultural - Appreciate cultural influences; appreciate the role of Britain's parliamentary system; participate in culture opportunities; understand, accept, respect and celebrate diversity

Purpose

Well-being is at the forefront of everything that we do at Elmwood Junior School. Our school values and ethos are embedded in the statement: 'Learning together, achieving together, bringing out the best in everyone'. Our curriculum enables children to build self-esteem, explore their values and attitudes and make informed decisions that affect their lives. It gives them an opportunity to develop their social skills, including assertiveness and negotiation, which is used in other areas of their everyday lives.

🧑 Pupil voice

Our curriculum will give children the opportunity to:

- make a positive contribution to the school and local community
- make choices about things that are important to them
- express their opinions on a range of different topics and issues
- say what they like and dislike about their learning experiences

Purpose

Pupil voice is central to our ethos. As a Rights Respecting School (Unicef GOLD 2019), the UN convention 'rights of the child' are at the centre of our curriculum. Teaching and learning about rights for the whole community is a central part of the journey to becoming a rights respecting citizen. Our pupils develop a strong sense of social justice and knowledge of local and global issues from a rights perspective. The School Council at Elmwood Junior School is made up of representatives from each class and aims to encourage pupils to have responsibility for the way things work and develop at school.
