



Dear Parents/Carers,

As you know, on **Friday 4th February**, we will be supporting NSPCC Number Day.

Don't forget that we would like everyone to come to school on that day wearing something number related! In exchange, it would be great if children could bring in a donation for the NSPCC charity (we suggest £1 each) – which will be collected on the day.

In preparation for the day, we would like to invite all the children to create a 'Maths About Me' poster (an example and a blank template are attached) where children need to think of numbers that are meaningful to them and represent each number in a separate section on the sheet. They can write, or draw why each number is special to them. For example, they may select 17 because it is the number on their front door; or the number 2012 because it is the year they were born. The more creative the better!

Children should bring their completed paper poster (A4) into school on any day by Friday 4<sup>th</sup> February. There will be a small prizes for the most creative posters from each year group.

As part of Number Day itself, the children will also have the chance to take part in a Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS) challenge (up until 7:30pm). TTRS are themselves, donating £5000 to support the NSPCC.

Have fun talking about numbers! After all, they are all around us! We look forward to an enjoyable Number Day, whilst we support a very worthwhile charity.
