
Year 3 Ancient Egyptian Entry point

This spring term, for our entry point, we became archaeologists and discovered the tomb of Tutankhamun. We took torches, broke down shafts and recorded the various artefacts we found, including the mummy of Tutankhamun! We examined some of the artefacts and discussed what this told us about King Tutankhamun. The children then came up with many questions about the Ancient Egyptian times, including our main enquiry question "Was everyone in Egypt an 'Ancient Egyptian?'.



Art project: Ancient Egyptian Art Headdresses

In Art, we looked at various headdresses and discussed the colours and patterns that were used. We talked about the patterns that they wanted to use and discussed what a portrait and a profile was. The children then sketched patterns and used a variety of mediums such as pastel and acrylic pens to create their own headdresses.



History: Ancient Egyptian Roles

We have had many exciting history lessons this half term. In this lesson, we looked at the different roles in Egypt and then the children acted out the roles and created their own social hierarchy pyramid.



English - Get into character!

In English, we became Tutankhamun and the children were able to ask the great 'Boy King' questions about life as a pharaoh in Egypt. This helped them when writing a non-chronological report all about Ancient Egypt and Tutankhamun.



Year 4

Time capsule

Year 4's half-termly theme for Spring 1 was 'Invention and Innovation'. To kick start this project, we looked at the inventions that are relevant in our lives, as well as things we felt summed up 2023. Each class was tasked with a collaborative writing piece as well as selecting a few items that gave a 'snapshot' of this year. We put all of these things together into a Time Capsule which we planted on the school grounds. The children were all very excited to be part of Elmwood history!



Year 4 William Morris Art Project

In Art this half term, year 4 have been studying the work of William Morris, looking at intricate design and pattern. We then designed our own clay initial tiles using his work as inspiration. Here are some examples of our beautiful completed pieces!



<u>Music</u>

Since September, Year 4 children have been learning to play an instrument - ukulele in 4R and 4K, and recorder in 4B and 4C.

In their final lessons with those instruments, the children played through a selection of the tunes and songs they have learnt to play. These were recorded and put onto Google Classrooms so that families can see what the children have been learning to do - we're sure you'll be impressed!



Now we are halfway through the year, the classes will be swapping over instruments for the second half of year 4.

Year 5 Year 5 Swimming Lessons

This half term 5F and 5J have been having swimming lessons at our local swimming pool. It has been lots of fun going in the morning, and a great way to start the day! We have learnt lots of different strokes including front crawl, breast stroke and back crawl. On one of the days, we even got to learn some life saving skills and had to wear our pyjamas in the pool. Next half term it is 5S and 5FST's turn to go swimming - they have a lot to look forward to.





Space exploration and NASA

Our theme this half term in Year 5 has been Space and Exploration. In English we focused on two texts -Hidden Figures and Curiosity: The Story of the Mars Rover. You have probably heard about Neil Armstrong being the first man on the moon, but have you heard about Mary Jackson, Dorothy Vaughan, Katherine Johnson and Christine Darden? They were three black female mathematicians who worked for NASA. The story is based around the work these ladies did, and it is called 'Hidden Figures' because until recently, a lot of their work went unnoticed despite their mathematical skill helping NASA make it into space. The work we are holding up is all about the Space Race, which the ladies from the book Hidden Figures helped the United States progress in. If it wasn't for them, Neil Armstrong might not have made it to the moon so quickly!



Art - Digital Space Art inspired by David Hockney

This half term we had a go at creating digital artwork inspired by David Hockney.

David Hockney is known for using bold and bright colours, and painting landscapes. This inspired us to create our own piece using the same bright and bold colours David does, and using space as our landscape. After researching his work, we had a go at sketching some ideas. When we had a rough idea of what we wanted our final piece to look like, we drew it out first using acrylic paint pens. Then we went onto recreating this on the iPads digitally. Graphic designers, illustrators, video game creators all use this technique to create artwork, and we can see why - our final pieces look creative and professional.

Our theme for this half term has been 'Migration' and in English, we looked at comparing life in the Caribbean to life in England, as if we were in the Windrush generation:




Visitors

On Friday 3rd February, our school supported the NSPCC Number Day. The children took part in 'Dress up for Digits' and spent part of the day exploring the importance of Maths in later life and how it is used in different careers. The children also competed in a nationwide Times Tables Rockstars competition called NSPCC Rocks and finished in 191st out of 2700 schools across the country!

Maz Evans Author Visit

On Wednesday 11th January, Maz Evans - author of the 'Who Let the Gods Out' series - visited our school. She had a Q&A session with Year 5 as they explored the first book in the series in the Autumn term. Maz commented on how impressive the children's questions were. She told them of her inspiration for writing, her resilience in publishing her books and why she created the characters she did. Maz then presented an assembly to the whole school and signed copies of her books in the library. The children were fantastic in welcoming Maz and I am sure that her visit inspired their love of reading and writing.

Mr Swan—grandfather to Mrs Swan Thompson and World War 2 Fighter Pilot

As part of this months Elmwood Learning Value being resilience I have asked the children to investigate their family history. Do they have any amazing stories of resilience from their family? Mrs Swan-Thompson has shared the story of her grandfather who had to persuade recruitment officers in 1939 that he was suitable to be a fighter pilot. He was at that time a Librarian! Mr Swan went on to fly Hurricanes in the North African campaign as well as test pilot Spitfires after the war. Please encourage your child to investigate your family history maybe your family has an amazing resilience story!
