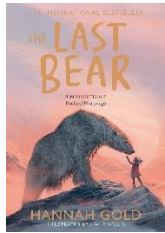

Year 6 Curriculum- Summer 1

English:

This half term will be centred around the book 'The Last Bear', a heart-warming story about an eleven-year-old girl on an adventure in the Arctic Circle. With themes of global warming and looking after our planet, it links nicely with our chosen theme for this half term 'Change'.



Entry point

SATs

The Year 6 standard assessment tests (SATs) begin on Tuesday 9th May. These tests are taken by every Year 6 child in England in order to assess their progress in Reading, SPAG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) and Maths. It is vital to remember that our pupils should give their best, as they always do, but that these tests should not impact on their well-being. We are proud of every one of our Year 6 pupils and how they have progressed at Elmwood. It is extremely important that your child attends school on these days. If they are feeling unwell, please encourage them to attend school at least for the morning to complete the tests. It is vital that they arrive at school on time throughout the week as preparation for the tests starts promptly after registration. We would greatly appreciate it if in the run up to, and throughout the week itself, your child has early nights in order for them to feel awake, ready and prepared for their busy day ahead. To help prepare the children every morning that week, we will be providing a breakfast of cereal, toast and a selection of fruit and yoghurts free of charge in the school hall. This will begin at 8:10am. Finally, we recommend that your child brings a bottle of water to ensure they stay hydrated during the tests.

The SATs structure will be as follows:

Tuesday 9th May: Grammar and Punctuation (45 mins) and Spelling (20 mins)

Wednesday 10th May: Reading (60 mins)

Thursday 11th May: Maths Arithmetic Paper 1 (30 mins) and Maths Reasoning Paper 2 (40 mins)

Friday 12th May: Maths Reasoning Paper 3 (40 mins)
