
Year 3 – Summer term 1


Dear Parents/Carers,

A big welcome back to all of you! We hope you had a wonderful Easter break and enjoyed spending some quality time together.


Our theme for this half term will be **Achievements that changed the world.** During this theme, the children will discover how the achievements of ancient civilisations have impacted us in today's world. The children have started the term off with an exciting entry point looking at amazing inventions from around the world. They then had to work in groups to create their own timeline and debate and discuss when they think each invention was created. Throughout this term, the children will also investigate three other ancient civilisations and answer the enquiry question 'What did all ancient civilisations have in common?' Through this enquiry, they will also discover what invention each ancient civilisation was responsible for. They will then display their knowledge at the end of the term by creating their own sustainable invention and presenting it to the class.

In English, our focus books will be:











In Writing, the children will be learning to write:

- Poems
- Adventure narrative
- Leaflet
- Setting descriptions

















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In Maths, the children will be learning about:

- Fractions
- Money and Time

It would be extremely beneficial to allow your child to have opportunities at home to tell the time. Children learn best with an analogue watch to start with. You could also ask them various time questions such as these:

What time is it when we go to school?

What time does your favourite show start?

This will really help them in understanding time and allow them to be able to confidently read off times on an analogue clock.
