Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome to the first edition newsletter for the new year. I can't believe we have already been back for 7 weeks. Hopefully your child has settled well with their class teacher and is enjoying the challenges that they will be facing as they learn in a new year group.

There are a lot of new things here at Elmwood Juniors, as you would expect, as we relent-lessly improve and develop the school. You will have all noticed the new Music and out-door learning area that arrived over the summer. Did you know that Elmwood was the first school in the country to have a full Steel Pan Orchestra? Well we now have a home for this and your child will be learning how to play this amazing instrument! Also new is the school logo, as chosen by us the Elmwood community, which is now on the school uniform. Elmwood children are wearing their uniform with real pride this year. Year 5


Art - Creating Gargoyles






Year 6






