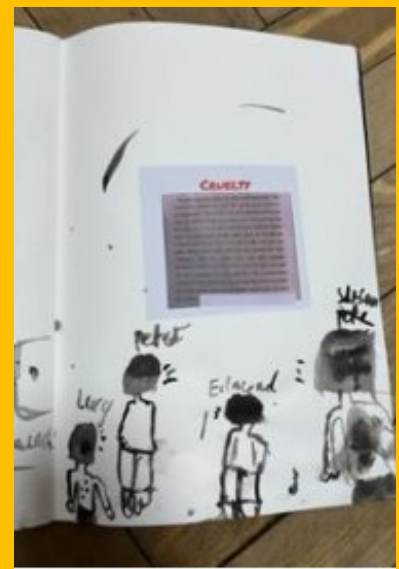
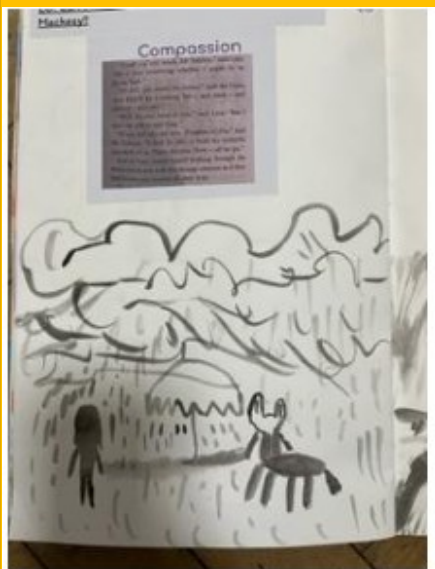
Year 4 - 'Cruelty vs. Compassion'

We have had a fun-filled and busy term in year 4. For our theme 'Compassion vs Cruelty' we began by learning more about the word meanings, linking them to real-life experiences and role playing scenarios from cue-cards. Combining our DT learning with our exit point, we challenged the children to be compassionate and donate their hand-made Christmas puppets to the year 3 play. The children really demonstrated their understanding of what it is to be compassionate and also loved seeing their puppets on the stage during the performance.



Art - Illustrations in the style of Charlie Mackesy

In Art this half term we have studied the work of illustrator, Charlie Mackesy. Most children were familiar with his book - 'The Boy, The Mole, The Fox and The Horse' but have really enjoyed researching his background, finding out more about what inspired him and seeing other work he has completed - particularly the links with the NHS during the pandemic. The children were tasked with creating two opposing illustrations in the style of Charlie Mackesy, depicting scenes of compassion or cruelty from 'The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe'. The work was completed using watercolour pens, a medium they were less familiar with. We were all impressed with the children's creativity!

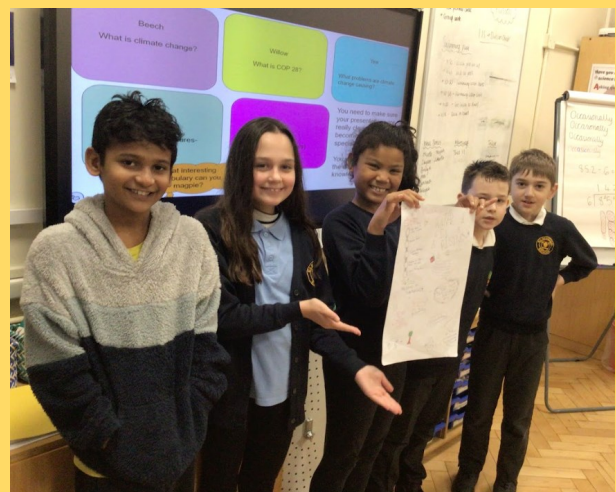

Year 5 Engineering our world

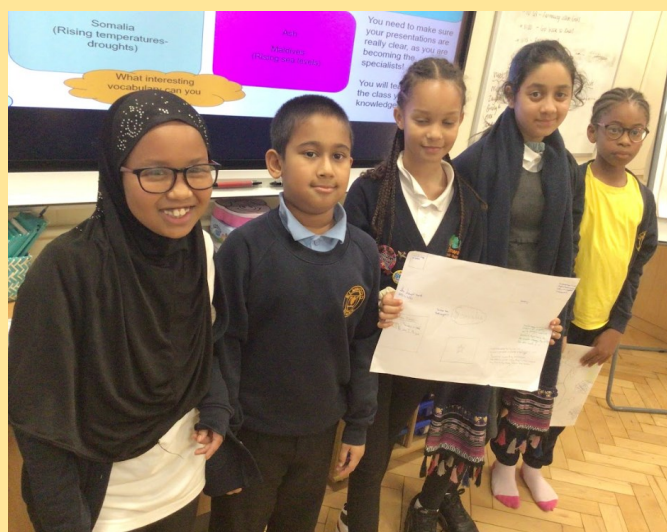
Year 5 kicked off the half term with a trip to the Science Museum. Our theme this half term has been engineering our world, and at the Science Museum we looked at some of the greatest inventions of all time. From aeroplanes to covid-19 vaccines, we saw it all, and learnt a lot! We even took part in a workshop called 'WonderLab', this quickly became a highlight of the day. Along with some of the Scientists that work at the museum we got to take part in some experiments, watch demonstrations, and explore and investigate different materials.



English - A World Full of Journeys and Migrations.

One of the books we have been reading in English this half term is 'A World Full of Journeys and Migrations' by Martin Howard. We looked at how migration has shaped society as we know it today, and talked about how boring the world would be if no one travelled. There are different reasons why people may choose to migrate, but we focused on the effect climate change is having in some countries (specifically the Maldives and Somalia) and how that is causing people to migrate.

The class became the teachers, and each group had a specific question about climate change or migration to research. We then became the teachers and taught the class about what we had found out.

Year 6— Activism and Enterprise

In English, we learned all about the Suffragette movement and their fight for gender equality in Britain. This led to us looking at Britain during this time, where the British Empire ruled over $\frac{1}{4}$ of the planet. In History, we questioned whether this was a good thing or not. This led us to our enquiry question: Can war ever be justified? We looked at the events that led to the outbreak of both the First and the Second World Wars (which we look at in more detail next half term). The year group created excellent historical analysis over these lessons.

We were visited by the 'Drama Geezers', who led the year group through lots of drama exercises culminating in the creation of our very own Activism trailers. Each class had a 50 minute session where they created their own 30-second activism trailer based on varied topics such as 'Black Lives Matter', 'Anti-Bullying' and 'Save our Oceans'. The year group showed so many of our Elmwood values in the session: Risk-Taker, Team Player, Open-mindedness, Creativity, Respect and Resilience.
